Two rings will be used for the morning classes. The Board of Directors reserve the right to make decisions on all problems that may arise. Non MWHS Members must pay a \$5 day membership fee for Insurance purposes each day.

Proof of Liability Insurance must be submitted with entry fees and forms.

All dogs and/or pets must be kept at the exhibitor's trailer during fair hours. No pets are to be moving about the grounds unless they are registered as part of a show or exhibit. Exception will be given to WORKING service animals.

For your pet's safety, they must be leashed while on the grounds & obey all posted signs.

OFFICE FEES: \$7 PER HORSE AND RIDER DAY and \$3 Additional Riders same Horse. Horses already entered in the show, Lead Line class only exempt from an additional office fee charge. Pre entries save time at office day of show.

Jr. B exhibitors are 12 & under on a Pony 13.2 hands & under. ALL YOUTH 18 & UNDER MUST WEAR A HELMET WHEN MOUNTED.

Novice exhibitors are any age on a horse over 13.2 hands, Junior Horses are 5 & under

Open classes are for exhibitors of any age on horses (any age) that are 13.2 hands & over

Show Management reserves the right to alter the order of the class list if necessary.

All stalls used in the Horse Barn MUST BE RESERVED IN ADVANCE, no later than October 1st.

Email all requests to: stallreservations@brigdenfair.ca to have the stall reservation form sent to you. LIMITED QUANTITY - BASED ON AVAILABILITY.

Stalls - \$10 per night. Shavings - \$10 per bag.

Please notify Shelley Thomson if you have a stall cancellation so the stall may be given to someone else.

Stalls are to be left clean when exhibitors are done with them. Anyone using stalls in the horse barn is responsible for cleaning them out into the manure spreader provided.

BEDDING WILL NOT BE PROVIDED

Gate admission of \$10.00 per person will be charged at the office if there is no one at the gate. You must show a gate stamp or current Moore Agricultural Society membership card to prove payment of gate fees. Elementary school children or younger are exempt from gate fees. For anyone coming Friday night for overnight stabling after 5 pm, you will be required to pay the admission fee being charged to enter the grounds for the Tractor pull which will be \$20 per person over the age of 13, NO EXCEPTIONS. It is recommended that only horses with a stall reserved come for overnight on the Friday due to the Tractor pull using the Horse Show parking.

Anyone with portable fencing or wishing to camp overnight must park south of the horse show pen and back laneway – not next to the show pen.
